Graduated at the Faculty of Law of the University of Niš in 2004, as the best graduated student in the 2003/2004 school year. Winning an award from the University and the City for outstanding achievements during his studies, he opens the door to working in the economy, and begins his career at AIK Bank AD Niš. With the prospect of further training abroad, Žarko accepted the invitation of academician Gradimir V. Milovanović, at that time Rector of the University of Niš, and transfers to the state sector - construction of facilities for state needs, and continued his education at the University of Antwerp (Belgium) within the scholarship program sponsored by The European Association for Education Law and Policy (ELA). Attracted by the diversity of thinking and versatility of his colleagues whom he met in a new environment, he accelerates the work on the preparation of his doctoral dissertation, and in parallel participates in several projects aimed at the development of economic and non-economic sectors in the Republic of Serbia. During his professional development, he was a collaborator on projects financed by Naled, USAID, GIZ, but also on various projects financed by private companies.

In 2012, he moved to the private sector again, this time as a Public Enforcement Agent, but developed more interests on Energy law. He won his doctorate title in 2015 on the topic: "The security supply of energy market as a legal - political paradigm of the regulatory framework", and with the help of the Andrejević endowment (as the winner of the competition) in2016, he published the monograph "Four Pillars of Security of Supply in the Energy Market". Since then, he regularly writes for many journals and institutions, and selected scientific and professional works can be found in many electronic libraries, the most important of which is the Google Scholar reference library.

As a legal expert who is familiar with the basics of programming, in cooperation with private companies, he launched an initiative to create specialized software for monitoring the enforcement process with modules for reporting to/for banks and lawyers, which software is used by more than 90% of public enforcement agents today. Starting in 2017, within the framework of the activities of the Institute Iuridica Prima from Ohrid (Republic of North Macedonia) as well as other professional organizations that bring together participants from several nations, he actively began writing scientific papers in the field of IT law, including the legal relations elaboration which are arising within the VR (virtual reality) systems.

He is a member of several consultative and decision-making bodies of project committees. He believes that today is responsible for the process of digitization of the necessary parameters and the creation of conditions for the accelerated development of all sectors, and by getting involved in various public and private projects in the field of human rights, energy, enforcement and digital changes, he wants to give his modest contribution.
